The Glen L. Rudd Foundation Scholarship

Glen L. Rudd spent a lifetime providing Christian service and humanitarian aid to his fellowmen. Much of his service was spent in the island nations of the South Pacific, particularly in New Zealand. His family has preserved this legacy of service through the establishment of a charitable foundation in his name. The foundation would like to assist in the higher education of Polynesian individuals who are also involved in service and other positive activities.

WHAT is the scholarship?

Assistance for higher education will be in the form of a grant of approximately \$1000 to help pay for text books, class fees, and/or partial tuition. Exact amount will be specified as recipients are chosen. This grant will be paired with a gift of a newly refurbished lap-top computer and printer.

WHO may apply?

Applicants must be Polynesian, including all descendants of the South Pacific. This individual will attend an institution of higher education, including university, college, trade school, etc., in the **fall of 2018**. It is not necessary for applicants to currently be high school students; we encourage older students to apply as well. Those hoping to defer a scholarship for any reason should wait until the year they will attend school to apply.
